The purpose of this amendment is to reallocate funds within the Action Plan budget, recognizing the additional needs beyond the current allocations for activities in the existing Action Plan. This amendment eliminates funding for several activities to further funds for needed activities

Narrative for Revised Program Funding by Activities:

Activity 1 Public Facilities & Infrastructure: Change in funding allocation for this activity

Amendment 1 will increase funding for this activity by \$708,300. Funding will be used to undertake additional infrastructure improvements. The replacement of small bridge/culvert estimated at \$800,000 to \$900,000 and flood migration improvement at several sewer pumping stations estimated at \$550,000 to \$600,000.

Activity 2 Single-Unit Housing Activities: Change in funding allocation for this activity.

Amendment 1 will decrease funding for this activity by \$203,835. This brings the total allocation of CDBG Disaster Recovery funds for this activity to \$96,165. This activity is completed no additional funds are needed.

Activity 3 Residential Property Acquisition Activities: Change in funding allocation for this activity.

Amendment 1 will decrease funding for this activity by \$454,465. This brings the total allocation of CDBG Disaster Recovery funds for this activity to \$0. The reduction represents de-obligation funds for this activity there was no essential acquisition needs in the community.

Activity 4 Multi-Unit Housing Activities: Change in funding allocation for this activity.

Amendment 1 will decrease funding for this activity by \$50,000. This brings the total allocation of CDBG Disaster Recovery funds for this activity to \$0. The reduction represents de-obligation funds for this activity since there was no actual multi-unit housings need in the community.

Activity 5 Business Recovery & Mitigation: Change in funding allocation for this activity.

Amendment 1 will decrease funding for this activity by \$150,000. This brings the total allocation of CDBG Disaster Recovery funds for this activity to \$0. The reduction represents de-obligation funds for this activity since there was no actual business recovery & mitigation needs in the community.

Activity 6 Hazard Mitigation & Planning: No Change in funding allocation for this activity.

Activity 7 General Administration: No Change in funding allocation for this activity.
