Newton Brophy – Speak on the ICE detention facility on Jefferson Blvd. and how the construction of facility has not yet been publicized. The center will include cells for short term detention and be used for the incarceration for community members. 75% of which have no criminal record. Asks if the city is comfortable with this facility and calls on the council to stop construction of this facility.

Nancy Green – People have a right to know that a jail Is being built on Jefferson Blvd., they have a right to be fully informed of the plans before it is built. Asks why it is necessary for ICE to expand and how many people the jail will be able to hold as well as how will it be staffed.

Enrique Sanchez – Spanish teacher Central High School, speaks on the future plans of ICE in Rhode Island and how it is disappointing to see families torn apart. The facility will be a heavy burden for Warwick tax payers.

Libby Merrill – Expresses strong objection toward the detention facility that will be used to lock up community members. Says the presence of ICE will instill fear in members of our community. ICE pulls families apart, most of whom have no prior criminal background. The City should seek to reduce number of those in confinement especially during a high COVID surge. Says ICE doesn't belong in Warwick and calls on the City to prevent ICE from opening this facility.
