## **General Communications –**

**McAllister-** Thanks the residence for their patience as a number of sanitation trucks went down. They will be catching up this week. A call was sent out to residences regarding the issue. It is federal money that will help you stay in your home if you're income was impacted from COVID over the last year and a half. Please reach out to Rhode Island Housing, the Mayor's Office or your City Council member.
