Thank you Councilman Solomon, Police/Fire pension. Thank you Mr. Carruolo, for allowing him to look at the letter from Gabriel Roder & Smith. City will see significant increase in cost of plan over 5-6 years. Do we really need actuary to explain about the plan? What we need is a schedule by year showing the cost to the City – Paying \$15 million in benefits – we are now in a critical state. Ask the Actuary to give us data by year, what it is going to cost the city for pensions.

Budget for City for the new year going up projected \$6mil less than \$1mil to school department. School Department t budget is coming in a few million \$ more than like to see. School dept budget figured w/o final figures from teacher's union contract (involved in negotiations) Wise Union settled saved \$1.5 mil and eliminated 64 positions. Total amount of payroll/benefits at 88% must be reduced; other departments are being short changed.

Three contracts coming up (police, fire, municipal) - stop the increases and some of the benefits for these unions.

It's not fair to the taxpayers, not fair to the 10,000 students. We need to stop the spending. We need to set an example
