

During the pandemic, a 3-3 was used to purchase remote support software licenses from TeamViewer. These were used (primarily) for the MIS team to offer remote support to those City employees working from home. When the renewal invoice came in earlier this year (\$ 1,844.16), we evaluated the need for these licenses under the current workplace situation and it was decided that we did not want to renew. Unfortunately, I took a passive non-renewal approach at that point, when in fact the licensing required written cancelation to avoid renewal. Several months after that date, we were contacted by Allen & Associates Collection and informed that the matter was turned over to them. Researching the issue, I discovered that I had, in fact, made a mistake in not providing written notification to the company. I forwarded the situation over to attorney Ursillo, whose advice was to pay the invoice since it was less than the cost of disputing the matter. I took it upon myself to request written confirmation that, if paid, no further license renewals would take place. That confirmation is attached.

Good morning Solicitor Ursillo,

I have just become aware of a situation that I would appreciate your or a member of your team's guidance on.

We, in the past, have used a software product called TeamViewer to allow us to remotely access people's computers to perform break/fix services. It has been a recurring expenditure for a number of years prior to my joining the City. During the Pandemic (2020), I actually increased our number of licenses to handle the needs of the increased work from home employees. When the renewal invoice came due this year, I spoke with my team and asked if we would need the same number of licenses. My team said they would require none. The Fire Department, which also used some of the licensing, eventually got back to me and said they could do without it as well.

Knowing no better, I simply chose to passively not renew it. I have just received notice from a collection agency (see attached). When I spoke with the gentleman and told him we no longer use the software, he said that "Almost everyone says that. But, you were obligated to terminate the agreement in writing. If you can show me written proof of doing that, we can clear this up." I obviously do not have that. At this point, I would like your legal direction on how to best proceed in responding.





This is a request under City Ordinance 6-12 to increase the award amount on Bid 2022-080, expiring June 30, 2022, by \$29,219.26 bringing the total amount for the Bid to \$79,219.26 for FY2022. This request would retain the through date of the Bid which is June 30, 2022.

The required additional amount will be used to cover the cost of a replacement for our Production Application server and related software which has reached end of life. The existing server is no longer covered under a service agreement and any prolonged outage would prohibit, or at least severely curtail, the use and availability of all locally hosted applications (other than MUNIS) within the City.

In the absence of any extraordinary changes, this will bring the available application server set up to current standards and should provide the City reliable service for the next 3 years. In 2024/2025 a number of infrastructure components will once again be coming up for replacement. It is our current plan to, at that time, evaluate an alternative operating structure and investigate the financial feasibility of moving the infrastructure out to a cloud based (IaaS) service platform. This would avoid the need for large scale hardware purchases every 3 to 5 years, provide a more flexible growth model, and offer a predictable need-based monthly cost model each year.

As with previous requests we have put this request out to our approved vendor list (see attached). We have one response so far and have set that as our "not to exceed amount". That quote is attached.

Funds for this increase will come from 25-799.

The police department is requesting to use funds from the 2021 JAG local grant to be used to purchase a tablet system for our motorcycles, E-bikes, and Marine Patrol boat. The tablet system and associated accessories would be a sole source purchased from:

Patrol PC, 344 John Dietsch Blvd Unit 2, North Attleboro, MA 02763

The items we wish to purchase are sole source products and are as follows:

- 1. Three (3) RhinoTab M1 tablets
- 2. Three (3) RhinoTab docking stations
- 3. Three (3) printer mounts
- 4. Two (2) printers for motorcycles
- 5. Two (2) motorcycle mounts
- 6. One (1) docking and printing system for our boat Marine 1, extended range antennas
- 7. One (1) bag mount and Bluetooth printing system for the E-Bikes
- 8. One (1) bicycle mountable computer bag for the RhinoTab system
- 9. One (1) mobile printer bag
- 10. One (1) mobile accessory bag
- 11. Assorted power cables and plugs

All three tablets are fully interchangeable with every vehicle and each docking system and printer combination. All components are fully compatible. There are multiple benefits for acquiring this technology: Motorcycle traffic officers will now have the ability to issue tickets from this platform while conducting traffic enforcement without having to issue the operator a handwritten violation. In the past if a handwritten ticket were to be issued the officer would have to return to headquarters to re-enter the violation digitally and mail the operator

an "official" copy due to RITT no longer accepting handwritten violations. Also, the bike patrol team and CP Officers will be able to conduct full investigations with access to our computer database, RILETS, and intercity information, as well as issue computer-printed violations while on bike patrols (to include parking tickets). Finally, officers assigned to the Marine Unit would be able to do the same while conducting maritime patrols while out on the water.

These tablets also can live stream body cameras and as such, provide additional benefits to SWAT applications, crisis negotiation operations, K9 callouts, etc. Making this purchase would provide a big advancement in the technological capabilities of our department with the cost being covered fully by grant funding.

This would be a one-time purchase for \$18,474.00. If approved, this will be paid for from the Police Department Operating Budget, Budget Code 33-352, 2021 JAG Local Grant.

Requirement to report actual or imminent breach of personally identifiable information (PII)

Congratulations on your recent award. The Office for Civil Rights (OCR), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) has been delegated the responsibility for ensuring that recipients of federal financial assistance from the OJP, the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS), and the Office on Violence Against Women (OVW) are not engaged in discrimination prohibited by law. Categorical Exclusion for City of Warwick

The Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding (CESF) Program allows eligible states, local units of government, and tribes to support a broad range of activities including preventing, preparing for, and responding to the coronavirus.

All recipients of CESF funding must assist BJA in complying with NEPA and other related federal environmental impact analyses requirements in the use of grant funds, whether the funds are used directly by the grantee or by a sub-grantee or third party.

BJA's expectation is that none of the following activities will be conducted whether under this federal award or a related third party action:

- (1) New construction
- (2) Any renovation or remodeling of a property located in an environmentally or historically sensitive area, including property (a) listed on or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places, or (b) located within a 100-year flood plain, a wetland, or habitat for an endangered species
- (3) A renovation that will change the basic prior use of a facility or significantly change its size
- (4) Research and technology whose anticipated and future application could be expected to have an effect on the environment
- (5) Implementation of a program involving the use of chemicals (including the identification, seizure, or closure of clandestine methamphetamine laboratories) other than chemicals that are (a) purchased as an incidental component of a funded activity and (b) traditionally used, for example, in office, household, recreational, or education environments.

Consequently, the subject federal action meets the Office of Justice Programs' criteria for a categorical exclusion as contained in paragraph 4(b) of Appendix D to Part 61 of Title 28 of the Code of Federal Regulations.

If, however, award funds are proposed to be used for any of the enumerated projects or activities above, grant recipients must contact their grant manager, and receive written approval prior to commencing that project or activity.
