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14	Section I. Chapter 4 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Warwick is hereby amended to
15	add the following:

17	Sec. 4-113. – Spaying and neutering of dogs and cats adopted from releasing agency –
18	Required; exemptions.
19	
20	(a) (1) No <u>licensed</u> releasing agency shall release, sell, trade, give away,
21	exchange, adopt out, or otherwise transfer with or without a fee any dog or cat that
22	has not been spayed or neutered unless the adopting party executes a written
23	agreement with the licensed releasing agency to have the dog or cat spayed or
24	neutered within 30 days of the adoption date or within 30 days from the date that
25	the dog or cat reaches sexual maturity, with the cost of such spaying or neutering
26	to be the responsibility of the adopting party. The written agreement must include
27	the dog or cat's age, sex, and general description; the date of adoption and the date
28	by which the dog or cat must be spayed or neutered; the adopting party's name,
29	address, phone number, and signature; the releasing agency's name, address,
30	phone number and the dollar amount of the deposit remitted. In addition to
31	executing the written agreement the adopting party must leave with the releasing
32	agency a deposit as provided in <u>section 18–1</u> . The amount of the deposit shall be
33	determined by the releasing agency. Said deposit will be refunded by the releasing
34	agency to the adopting party upon presentation of a written statement or receipt
35 26	from a licensed veterinarian of the adopting party's choice where the dog or cat was spayed or neutered providing that the spaying or neutering was performed
36 37	was spayed of neutered providing that the spaying of neutering was performed within the 30 day period. Alternatively, the releasing agency shall make
38	appropriate arrangements for the spaying or neutering of the dog or cat by a
39	licensed veterinarian and have the surgery completed before releasing the dog or
40	cat to the adopting party. in accordance with subdivisions (2) and (3).
41	(2) The licensed releasing agency is authorized to enter into a written adoption
42	agreement with the adopting party provided that at the time of execution of the
43	written agreement, the licensed releasing agency collect from the adopting party
44	an amount equal to the cost to the licensed releasing agency for the spaying or

1	neutering of the dog or cat to be adopted. The written agreement must include the					
2	dog or cat's age, sex, and general description; the date the adoption agreement was					
3	executed; the date by which the licensed releasing agency anticipates that the dog					
4			or cat will be spayed or neutered; the date by which the adoptive party shall claim			
5			the dog or cat; the adopting party's name, address, phone number, and signature;			
6			the licensed releasing agency's name, address, phone number, and the dollar			
7			amount remitted to the licensed releasing agency for the cost of spaying or			
8		(2)	<u>neutering the dog or cat.</u>			
9		(3)	After execution of the agreement, the licensed releasing agency shall cause the			
10			dog or cat to be spayed or neutered and, when medically fit, shall transfer custody			
11			of the dog or cat to the adopting party. Any dog or cat that is not claimed by the			
12			adoptive party within ten (10) days of the date enumerated in the written adoption			
13			agreement shall be considered unclaimed and may be offered for adoption to			
14 15			another party.			
15 16	(b)	The f	ollowing are exemptions from the provisions of subsection (a) of this section:			
17	(0)	(1)	A releasing agency returns a stray dog or cat to its owner.			
18		(1) (2)	A releasing agency receives a written report from a licensed veterinarian stating			
19		(2)	that the life of the dog or cat would be jeopardized by the surgery and that such			
20			health condition is likely to be permanent.			
21		(3)	A releasing agency receives a written report from a followup program to ensure			
22		(0)	that dogs and cats adopted from the releasing agency are spayed or neutered and a			
23			licensed veterinarian stating that there is a temporary health condition, including			
24			sexual immaturity, which would make surgery life-threatening to the dog or cat or			
25			impracticable, in which instance the releasing agency shall grant the adopting			
26			party an appropriate extension of time in which to have the dog or cat spayed or			
27			neutered based on the veterinarian's report.

29	The e	xemptic	ons provided in subsections (b)(2) and (3) of this section shall only be applicable if			
30	the releasing agency receives said written report from a licensed veterinarian within the 30 day					
31	period	d during	which the spaying or neutering would otherwise be required, or, in the case of a			
32	report	t conten	nplated by subsection (b)(2) of this section, said report may be provided to the			
33	releasing agency during any temporary extension period provided by subsection (b)(3) of this					
34	sectio	on if the	health condition of the dog or cat has changed.

36	(c)	-	uested to do so, a releasing agency shall refund deposited funds to the adopting party			
37			reasonable proof being presented to the releasing agency by the adopting party that			
38			og or cat died before the expiration of the period during which the spaying or			
39		neuter	ring was required to be completed.

41	(d)	•	and all releasing agencies:			
42		(1)	May enter into cooperative agreements with each other and with veterinarians in			
43			carrying out the provisions of this section; and			
44		(2)	Shall make a good faith effort to cause an adopting party to comply with the			
45			provisions of this section.
