On November 13, 2019, at 8:15 a.m., Officer Johnson met with Councilman Ladouceur in the vicinity of 333 Sandy Lane. His constituents are requesting a crosswalk in the vicinity on Sandy Lane, east of Hague Road. It was reported that several neighbors, including a gentleman who is visually impaired cross Sandy Lane to attend school or church service at St. Kevin's. The pastor, Father Marciano, also is requesting a crosswalk for pedestrian safety.

Officer Johnson concurs with Councilman Ladouceur that a crosswalk is needed in this area. It is recommended that one be installed not at an intersection, but to the east of Hague Road, just east of pole #31 (on the south side) and east of the driveway for St. Kevin's Church (on the north side).

Crosswalks that are not at an intersection, need to be marked with warning signs prior to the crosswalk in both directions. Additionally, crosswalk signs are required at the crosswalk itself. Pole #31 would be an option on the east side, otherwise sign posts would have to be installed for the other three signs. Generally, parking is not an issue in this area, so additional parking restrictions are currently not deemed to be necessary.
