RESOLUTION RELATIVE TO PLACING UNSIGNALIZED CROSSWALK SIGNS ON  
NEWBURY ROAD, CARNATION DRIVE AND ASYLUM ROAD

Resolved that,

WHEREAS, the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Warwick are matters of paramount importance to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the City Council that a very dangerous situation exists at the intersections of Newbury Road, Carnation Drive and Asylum Road; and

WHEREAS, a traffic survey was conducted by the Police Department which recommended that unsignalized pedestrian crosswalk signs be erected at the crosswalks on Newbury Road, Carnation Drive and Asylum Road; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, by virtue of the authority of Chapter 76 Article 1 Section 76-13 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Warwick, may determine that certain traffic signs are required for the protection of the public safety.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Director of Public Works is hereby directed to erect unsignalized pedestrian crosswalk signs be erected at the crosswalks on Newbury Road, Carnation Drive and Asylum Road.

The City Clerk is hereby directed to forward a copy of this Resolution to the Director of Public Works and the Chief of the Police Department.

This Resolution shall take effect upon passage.

1 Police Information - TRAFFIC SURVEY FOR SS AT CARNATION DR/ASYLUM RD

On 09/05/16, this officer was assigned a request for a traffic study (study #2016-15) which was submitted to the Warwick Police Department Traffic Division by City Counsel President Donna Travis. The survey was to address an issue concerning Carnation Dr. and the possible stop sign placement at Carnation Dr. and Asylum Rd. in order to address a crosswalk at that location which children frequent on their way to the Park School.

Upon doing an aerial map reconnaissance on Google Maps the crosswalk on Asylum Rd. at the intersection of Carnation Dr. is clearly visible. This officer also went out to the area and surveyed the site in person. There was a crosswalk in that area which runs in a north to south direction. The intersection itself is a ninety degree intersection with the primary flow of traffic running north to south on Asylum Rd. Carnation Dr. enters from the easterly direction and traffic on Carnation Dr. does not have the right of way. However, due to the crosswalk and the age of the children who cross through the crosswalk during school days, it is requested that an unsignalized pedestrian crosswalk sign be recommended and erected in that area. It is suggested that the signs be erected on Newberry Rd., Carnation Dr., and Asylum Rd., as there are three crosswalks within an approximate one hundred and fifty foot area of each. There are eight examples of unsignalized pedestrian crosswalk signs in the manual Uniform Traffic Code Devices 2009 edition that could be erected in that area. This officer suggests erecting sign RI-6A which is a yellow / white / and red sign constructed of high visibility material which clearly states that it is a state law to stop for pedestrians within the crosswalk.

The signs can be erected in the vicinity of all three crosswalks. Once the signage has been approved, this officer if notified can work with the sign department of the City Highway Division in order to appropriately place the signs.
