PCR-13-22 1 2 THE CITY OF WARWICK 3 4 STATE OF RHODE ISLAND 5 RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL 6 NO._____ DATE____ 7 APPROVED_____MAYOR 8 9 10 A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ENACT LEGISLATION REQUIRING MUNICIPAL NOTICE AND OPPORTUNITY TO JOIN AS A THIRD 11 12 PARTY BENEFICIARY TO CONTRACTS BETWEEN THE STATE AND PROPERTY OWNERS OR OPERATORS THAT USE A PROPERTY 13 IN VIOLATION OF MUNICIPAL ZONING 14 15 16 Resolved that, 17 WHEREAS, the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Warwick are matters of 18 paramount importance to the City Council; and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, on August 19, 2021, pursuant to Article IX of the Rhode Island Constitution and the Rhode Island General Laws in Title 30, Chapter 15 entitled "Emergency Management", 22 Governor McKee declared a new state of emergency for new Covid-19 variants, which has been 23 24 extended through subsequent executive orders until February 4, 2022; and 25 26 WHEREAS, R.I.G.L. § 30-15-7 establishes that the Governor is primarily responsible for 27 emergency management in the state and provides additional general powers of the Governor for 28 carrying out Emergency Management obligations; and 29 30 WHEREAS, R.I.G.L. § 30-15-4 establishes limitations on Emergency Management 31 authority; and 32 WHEREAS, the State of Rhode Island has disbursed substantial sums of Federal 33 34 Emergency Management Agency disaster assistance funding relative to COVID-19 to support many critical public health, welfare and safety programs, including the Consolidated Homeless 35 Fund Program at the State of Rhode Island Office of Housing and Community Development; and 36 37 38 WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the Warwick City Council that the state contracted with an operator using federal disaster assistance COVID-19 funding for critical public 39 40 health, welfare and safety programs at a property in the City in a manner that presents potential violations of the Warwick Zoning Ordinance; and 41 42 43 WHEREAS, the Warwick City Council desires that the General Assembly provide notice

and opportunity to participate as a third party beneficiary in contracting between the state and

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property owners or operators when emergency management authority or resources are being used in a manner that presents potential or actual violations of local zoning ordinances, by limiting the statutory emergency management authority accordingly.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Warwick City Council hereby respectfully requests the General Assembly to enact legislation requiring municipal notice and opportunity to join as a third party beneficiary to contracts between the state and property owners or operators that use a property in violation of municipal zoning, by amending R.I.G.L. § 30-15-4 as follows:

§ 30-15-4. Limitations.

Nothing in this chapter shall be construed:

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(1) To interfere with the course or conduct of a labor dispute except that actions otherwise authorized by this chapter or other laws may be taken when necessary to forestall or mitigate imminent or existing danger to public health or safety;

(2) To interfere with dissemination of news or comment on public affairs; but any communications facility or organization (including, but not limited to, radio or television stations, wire services, and newspapers) may be required to transmit or print public service messages furnishing information or instructions in connection with a disaster emergency;

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(3) To affect the jurisdiction or responsibilities of police forces, firefighting forces, or units of the armed forces of the United States, or of any personnel thereof, when on active duty; but state and local disaster emergency plans shall place reliance upon the forces available for performance of functions related to disaster emergencies; or

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(4) To limit, modify, or abridge the authority of the governor to proclaim martial law or exercise any other powers vested in the governor under the constitution, statutes, or common law of this state independent of, or in conjunction with, any provisions of this chapter-; or

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(5) To allow for any contract that causes a property to be used in a manner that is in violation of municipal zoning ordinance, unless the chief executive officer of the city or town in which the property is located is provided advanced notice of the contract and the option to be added to the contract as a third party beneficiary, providing the city or town:

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(i) The right, but not the obligation, to enforce rights, remedies, powers and privileges under the contract; and

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(ii) Compensation amounting to three percent (3%) of the total consideration of the contract, provided, however, that the city or town shall not be obligated to use such compensation to mitigate the impact of the use of the property.
