RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF APPLICATION FOR FUNDS FOR THE OAKLAND
BEACH STORM WATER PROJECT FROM THE RHODE ISLAND COMMUNITY
DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT DISASTER RECOVERY PROGRAM

Resolved that,

WHEREAS, the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Warwick are matters of paramount importance to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City is applying for \$80,000.00 for the Oakland Beach storm water project; and

WHEREAS, funds are available under the Rhode Island Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery Program, administered by the Executive Office of Commerce, Office of Housing and Community Development; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Rhode Island has authorized the Director of said department to disburse such funds; and

WHEREAS, it is in the interest of the citizens of the City of Warwick that application be made to undertake a local Community Development Disaster Recovery Program.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Warwick that the filing of this application for \$80,000.00 is hereby authorized and that the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to file this application with the Office of Housing and Community Development, to provide any additional information or documents required by said office, to make any assurances required in connection with this program, to execute an agreement with the State of Rhode Island and to otherwise act as the representative of the City of Warwick in all matters relating to this application and any award which may be based upon this application.

This Resolution shall take effect upon passage.

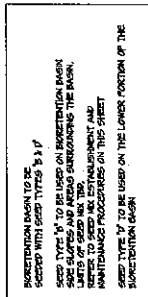

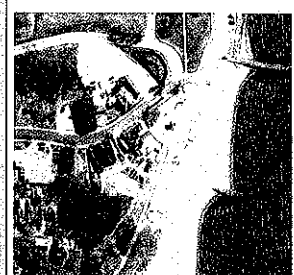
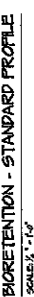
GREEN AND RESILIENT INFRASTRUCTURE PLAN

WORETENTION SEED MIXES ESTABLISHMENT AND MAINTENANCE

INTERESTS AND BUSINESS CONNECTIONS

REDUCES THE OVERALL HEIGHT OF THE VEGETATION APPEARS TO BE AT OR ABOVE 6-8 INCHES OUT BACK TO A HEIGHT OF ABOUT 6-9 INCHES. DO NOT CUT MUCH LOWER THAN 6 INCHES, ESPECIALLY IN THE WINTER MONTHS! THIS MIGHT CAUSE DAMAGE TO THE PLANTS AND SOIL. THE BEST TIME TO CUT IS IN THE LATE SUMMER OR EARLY FALL, WHEN THE PLANTS ARE BEGINNING TO DIE BACK. IT IS ALSO IMPORTANT TO REMEMBER THAT THE PLANTS WILL REGENERATE FROM THE ROOTS, SO IT IS IMPORTANT TO LEAVE SOME OF THE PLANTS ALIVE. SECOND YEAR: THAT GOOD ESTABLISHMENT DID NOT OCCUR DURING THE FIRST YEAR (IE. IF THE WIND PRESSURE YOU FEEL THAT GOOD ESTABLISHMENT TO BE TOO STRONG) THEN THE FIRST YEAR MAINTENANCE PROTOCOL MAY NEED TO BE CONTINUED INTO THE SECOND YEAR. ALTHOUGH CUTTING HEIGHT SHOULD BE INCREASED BY ABOUT 2-4 INCHES.

CAUTION: WHEN USING THE MAINTENANCE PROTOCOL, THE ORIGINAL MAINTENANCE PROTOCOL SHOULD BE TO CUT AFTER ALL SEED HAS SET IN THE WINTER MONTHS. THIS WINTER CUT CAN BE SUFFICIENT TO PREVENT THE WOODY PLANT FROM ESTABLISHING ON THE SITE AND MAY PREVENT THE WOODY PLANT FROM SPREADING TO THE WOODY PLANT PRESERVE. THE WINTER CUT SHOULD BE DONE AFTER THE WOODY PLANT PRESERVE HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED. A WINTER CUT ON SITE IS SOONALLY OR MORE EFFECTIVE THAN A WINTER CUT OFF SITE. ALWAYS CHECK WITH YOUR LOCAL FIRE DEPARTMENT FOR ANY LOCAL ORDINANCES REGARDING BURNING.

ACTIVE WILLOW-LOWERS GROW HERE ARE SLOW, AND MAY REQUIRE 2-4 YEARS TO FULLY ESTABLISH. MANY WILLOW-LOWERS DO NOT BLOOM THE FIRST YEAR AFTER PLANTING A SINGLE ROSETTE (A SMALL GROUP OF PLANTS THAT GROW CLOSE TO THE GROUND) AND A DEEP ROOT SYSTEM. THE FIRST YEAR WILL GROW AND PRODUCE SEED. IN SECOND YEAR, WILLOW-LOWERS NEED AREAS NOT RECOMMENDED FOR STEEPER SLOPED SITES WITHOUT ASSURED SOIL CONTROL MEASURES. FERTILIZERS ARE GENERALLY NOT RECOMMENDED.

UNITED PATHWAYS CAN BE MAINTAINED AS RESOURCES THROUGHOUT THE WILDLIFE AND SEEDING AREAS.
