On 08/21/17 this officer received a request for a traffic study in reference a stop sign application at certain intersections of Sargent St. at Cherry St. and Ash St.

This officer called and spoke with the reporting party, identified as Jeremy Rix, who is a Warwick City Council member who had emailed the city on behalf of himself and other members of his neighborhood in order to address a possible safety issue at the intersections of Sargent St. and Cherry St. as well as Sargent St. and Ash St. This officer spoke with Councilman Rix about his concerns which he stated that there were multiple unmarked four way intersections in his neighborhood; however, he felt that Sargent St. and Cherry St. and Sargent St. and Ash St. could use attention at this point.

After hearing what Councilman Rix had to say and what his concerns were, this officer explained his role in performing a traffic study. Upon conclusion of the conversation, it was determined that yield signs would be more appropriate with placing those yield signs on Sargent St. in both the northwest and southeast sides of Sargent St. at the intersection of Cherry St. and then one yield sign on the northwest side of Sargent St. in order to address traffic flowing from Blythe St. towards Post Rd. on Sargent St. This officer also advised Councilman Rix for future stop sign applications, that there is a frequently asked questions section on the WPD website which addresses the proper usage of stop and yield sign as well as when and where to place those signs. He also explained his references for the sign and placement. This officer directed Councilman Rix to the Manual of Traffic Control Devices from which this officer cited in selecting the locations of where to put the yield signs.

This traffic study will be forwarded to the City Council and then to the sign department for appropriate action.
