14	OF POWER OUTAGES

16	Resolved that,
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18	WHEREAS, the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Warwick are
19	matters of paramount importance to the City Council; and
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21	WHEREAS, with repeated power outages on Warwick Neck, homeowners and businesses are
22	suffering losses, and we have not yet hit the heavy, winter weather; and
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24	WHEREAS, these power outages create more than a temporary inconvenience and present a
25	real out of pocket cost to homeowners and the businesses on Warwick Neck and throughout the city,
26	with a true loss in income to the city and the state; and
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28	WHEREAS, property owners increasingly need generators to maintain warmth (or air
29 20	conditioning) in their homes, refrigeration for food and dairy products, power for certain medical
30 31	devices, and stoves for cooking, all of which are a cost and inconvenience (There is the additional risk of frozen pipes and resultant damage in homes, places of worship, schools and businesses.); and
31 32	Tisk of frozen pipes and resultant damage in nomes, places of worship, schools and businesses.), and
32 33	WHEREAS, there is also added cost and inconvenience to businesses, including three major
34	event venues – Warwick Country Club, Our Lady of Providence's Aldrich Mansion, and Harbor
35	Lights that require additional generators to service events; and
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37	WHEREAS, power disruptions do more than inconvenience bridal parties and social events
38	because they cause lost revenue to the city and state because of cancellations. Power outages also
39	mean these facilities have to close, with lost wages for temporarily-sent home hospitality staff, lost
40	revenues to subcontractors and vendors – and in turn, more lost revenue to the city and state; and
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42	WHEREAS, for other small businesses on Warwick Neck Avenue, without generators, there
43	are similar lost wages for workers and lost revenues to the city and state; and
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45	WHEREAS, multiplying this across the city, particularly for those that are frequently affected

1	by power outages, it is clear there is a real cost to homeowners, small businesses, workers, and to the
2	city and state.
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4	WHEREAS, there are organizations and individuals with the expertise to conduct fiscal
5	impact studies, and with the probability of future power outages, we ought to have a clear, empirical
6	understanding of what those economic impacts are.
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8	NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the City Council hereby recommends that
9	the City hire of a professional firm or individual to conduct an economic impact study on the effects
10	of power outages on homeowners and businesses in the City.
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12	The City Clerk is hereby directed to forward a copy of this Resolution to the Planning
13	Department Director and the Mayor.
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15	This Resolution shall take effect upon passage.
