1. **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT** this Resolution is an affirmative action of the City Council of the City toward the execution and delivery of the Lease Purchase Financing Documents in accordance with the purposes of the laws of the State. This Resolution constitutes the City's declaration of official intent, pursuant to Treasury Regulation 1.150(2), to reimburse the City for certain expenditures paid on or after the date of which is sixty (60) days prior to the date of this Resolution, but prior to the execution and delivery of the Lease Purchase Financing Documents. Such amounts to be reimbursed shall not exceed \$532,376.00 and shall be reimbursed not later than eighteen (18) months after (a) the date on which the expenditure is paid or (b) the date the property is placed in service or abandoned, but in no event later than three (3) years after the date the expenditure is paid.

The Police Department went out to bid for (14) new police vehicles under bid# 2018-180 and received three qualified bids from the following companies:

MHQ 401 Elm Street Marlborough MA 01772	\$550,283.00
Zee Ford DBA Ford of Branford 301 E. Main St. Branford, CT 06405	\$532,376.00
Rodman Ford, 45 Washington St. Foxboro, MA 02035.	\$567,888,44

Based on a review of these bids, the Police Department is recommending that the bid be awarded to Zee Ford, being the lowest qualified bidder for all specified vehicles. The Police Department has conducted research into Zee Ford and has spoken to departments that have contracted with them in the past, and are confident that they will provide quality products in a timely manner.

The makes and models of the vehicles are as follows:

The specifications for equipment and accessories that will be added to these vehicles are contained in the bid package. Having several of the aftermarket pieces of equipment that are to be installed has allowed us to keep the up-fitting costs down. These are parts from older police cars that will be provided to Zee Ford for installation. This is also indicated in the bid specifications.

All of these vehicles will be used by frontline personnel in accordance with the department's Fleet Management Procedure. The 14 front line patrol vehicles that are replaced will be repurposed as Community Policing vehicles, School Resource Officer vehicles and Detective Unit vehicles. In addition, those vehicles will then be

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transitioned as Reserve "R" cars for details and in many instances, these 6 year old vehicles will be given to other city departments for use until they are sold at auction. The purchase of these 14 new patrol cars is not only essential for the safe and efficient public safety mission, it is also critical to maintain a fleet of secondary and tertiary vehicles to accomplish various equally important functions of the police mission; for instance community policing, investigative work and roadside detail work.

Our fleet plan, which relies on the purchase of 14 cars per year has been in place for several years and has been proven as a strategic way of maintaining top notch first line patrol vehicles that our officers can rely on, as well as provide for well maintained "used" vehicles that our ancillary divisions can depend on to conduct their daily business. Skipping just one year of a vehicle purchase will not only effect the 14 patrol vehicles but will also have an impact on the 28 cars that would have been replaced through the trickledown effect when cars are replaced.

The total amount, if approved, would be \$532,376.00 and would be funded by utilizing Lease Purchase funds. The Warwick Police Department currently does not have a budget line item for police vehicles and has historically relied on the system of lease purchase to acquire new vehicles.
