Workers Compensation Bid - GL 79-170

As you are aware, the City went out to bid for a worker's compensation administrator. That bid's intent was to obtain a service agreement to provide assistance in handling the City of Warwick's Self Insured Workers' Compensation Program for Municipal employees. The Uniform Police and Fire are not included nor the employees of the school department. The successful bidder will together with the City manage and administer the Self-Insured Workers' Compensation Program in accordance to the State of Rhode Island laws.

The City received bids from three vendors, including one from Beacon Mutual Insurance Company, the City's current provider who are located in Warwick. Claim Strategies is located in East Providence, and PMA is located in Meriden, Connecticut.

There are three evaluation components to the bid - 1) Overall Cost of the bid - 50%; 2) Demonstrated experience and capabilities of the Firm - 40%; and 3) Firm's organizational resources 10%. The City also reserved the right to accept all or part of the proposals for one, two or three year terms.

The bid specifications also stated that the City's preferred method was a Unified Bid Cost to which all bidders responded with that method.

The Personnel Department is recommending that the bid be awarded to Claims Strategies Insurance the overall qualified evaluated bidder that meets the specifications of the bid, for a three year contract period at a cost of \$13,000 for the first year, \$13,000 for the second year, and \$15,000 for the third year and a one-time cost for existing open claims of \$5,500.

Although our current provider is Beacon Mutual who has provided exceptional services we feel that the City will save with contracting with Claims Strategies. Our recommendation is based on the fact that Claims Strategies has been a provider in the past and we find them very qualified and they are the overall lowest bidder. The bid from PMA if selected was requiring three months of the cost of estimated claims and expenses to be escrowed where the specifications called for only \$30,000. The estimated cost of 3 months of claims and expenses for fiscal year 2018 is \$57,595 which doubles the amount necessary the City would need to cover if PMA was selected.

Based on the above, the City recommends Claims Strategies Insurance, for a three year contract at the costs stated above.

Re: Bid#2018-247 Cold Water Meters

Recently the Water Division sought bids for a two year contract for the purchase of various sized cold water meters which are installed in various residential, commercial, and deduct meter accounts. As you are aware, the Water Division purchases one particular brand which is compatible with the balance of the existing inventory, reading equipment, and billing software (MUNIS). Unlike the purchase of other goods and services, standardization for equipment in the utility industry is imperative, ultimately reducing the overall costs of maintenance, replacement, and upgrading to newer more sophisticated reading technology. Any change in equipment, including meters, would result in a stranded multimillion investment over the past decades.

The bidding process resulted in one bid being reviewed which meets the bid/proposal specifications. The sole distributor for Neptune products in the New England area is Ti-Sales, who submitted a bid as in the past.

For information purposes only, the Water Division has 27,000 metered accounts of which approximately 13,000 accounts

are considered "radio" reads (Drive/Walk-by accounts). In addition, there are nearly 500 ARB accounts which can be upgraded to radio reads. In short, it would probably cost about \$1,250,000 to upgrade the remainder of the system to a total drive-by system similar to the technology utilized by providence Water Supply Board and National Grid. This doesn't include the possible utilization of outside vendors to assist with the change out and/or downsizing of existing commercial accounts.

In Addition, it should be noted that nearly 525 deduct meters have been installed since the Water Division initiated the newer design for purchase and installation of this metering of outdoor water usage. It has resulted in nearly a \$138,500 source of income which offsets the purchase of meters on the expense side of our budget (179 meters @ \$44,000 FY 2016/2017.

Therefore, based on the bid provided by Ti-Sales, I am recommending that Ti-Sales be awarded a two year contract for an amount not to exceed \$225,000 (\$50,000 FY18, \$125,000 FY19, and \$50,000 FY20).



#### Mrs. Peshka:

The Police Department is seeking authorization to expend monies from both our Federal Asset Forfeiture and State Asset Forfeiture accounts to purchase an undercover vehicle. This vehicle will be used by a member of the Special Operations Group in their capacity as a member of this undercover unit. The department, over the past 3 years sold at auction (using the city bid process) 11 vehicles. Each of these vehicles sold had been vehicles acquired by the agency via the state seizure process; essentially they were turned over to the police department as part of criminal narcotics cases. Per Rhode Island General Law 21-28-5.01 (1) the seizing agency shall be allowed to apply the proceeds of the sale of the vehicles towards the purchase of an appropriate vehicle for use in activities reasonably related to law enforcement duties. If we do not elect to purchase a vehicle for law enforcement use, we are statutorily required to give the money to the Attorney General's Office which in turn will disperse the funds; causing us to lose 30% of the money. Total value of the sale of the above mentioned 11 vehicles is \$8,503.20.

Based on its use and designation, the Police Department reserves the right to locate and acquire a vehicle which suits the need and purpose of this particular assignment in accordance with established guidelines. Accordingly, the Department is requesting an exception to the bid process for the reasons listed below:

- The bid process and associated council approval for the purchase of this vehicle would cause an unnecessary time
  delay in the purchase and would restrict the Police Department's ability to negotiate a good deal for the vehicle.
  In the past, this approach was taken, however the dealers were unable to keep the cars available as they were sold
  to other customers before the standard purchase process could be completed.
- The inherent nature of Undercover Police work requires anonymity and discretion in the identification of its
  officers and vehicle descriptions. The Police Department reserves the right to keep the descriptions of vehicles
  used by its narcotics officers extremely closely guarded to protect the safety of its officers and the integrity of
  their investigations.
- The use of undercover vehicles is a critical and necessary part of conducting police operations in the City.
  Without the use of undercover vehicles, the Department would be hampered in its' mission objectives to prevent
  and deter crime. They are important tools in combating a variety of criminal actions, including but not limited to,
  narcotics, prostitution and burglary.

It is the Department's intention to seek out local vendors, request them to provide us with a list of vehicles which meet our specifications, and purchase the vehicle which is the most suited for our needs and the most cost efficient. This would

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be accomplished after receiving Council approval. We would certainly make every effort to use local vendors. Due to the nature of this purchase and objectives of the SOG Unit, we would respectively request that the descriptions of the vehicles be kept confidential and on a need to know basis only.

The total cost of this purchase is \$15,000.00. Funding for these vehicles, if approved, would be allocated from the State Asset Forfeiture Fund, Code 366-0400 (\$8,503.20) and up to \$6,496.80 from the Federal Asset Forfeiture Fund, Code 364-0400. Attached you will find a list of the 11 vehicles that were sold, along with associated sale price as well as the applicable statue concerning forfeiture of property and money.

## TITLE 21 Food And Drugs

## CHAPTER 21-28 Uniform Controlled Substances Act

## ARTICLE 21-28-5.01 Powers of Enforcement Personnel

**SECTION 21-28-5.04** 

#### § 21-28-5.04. Forfeiture of property and money.

- (a) Any property, real or personal, including, but not limited to, vessels, vehicles, or aircraft, and money or negotiable instruments, securities, or other things of value or any property constituting, or derived from any proceeds, furnished, or intended to be furnished, by any person for the transportation of, or in exchange for, a controlled substance and that has been, or is being used, in violation of § 21-28-4.01(a) or 21-28-4.01(b) or in, upon, or by means of which any violation of §§ 21-28-4.01(a) or 21-28-4.01(b) or §§ 21-28-4.01.1 or 21-28-4.01.2 or 21-28-4.08 has taken, or is taking place, and all real property including any right, title, and interest in the whole of any lot or tract of land and any appurtenances or improvements that is used in the commission of a violation of §§ 21-28-4.01(a) or 21-28-4.01(b) or §§ 21-28-4.01.1 or 21-28-4.01.2 or 21-28-4.08, or that was purchased with funds obtained as a result of the commission of a violation of §§ 21-28-4.01(a) or §§ 21-28-4.01(b) or §§ 21-28-4.01.1 or 21-28-4.01.2 or 21-28-4.08, shall be seized and forfeited; provided that no property or money, as enumerated in this subsection, used by any person shall be forfeited under the provisions of this chapter unless it shall appear that the owner of the property or money had knowledge, actual or constructive, and was a consenting party to the alleged illegal act. All moneys, coin and currency, found in close proximity to forfeitable controlled substances, to forfeitable drug manufacturing or distributing paraphernalia, or to forfeitable records of the importation, manufacture, or distribution of controlled substances, are presumed to be unlawfully furnished in exchange for a controlled substance or used in violation of this chapter. The burden of proof is upon claimants of the property to rebut this presumption.
- (b) Property taken or detained under this section shall not be repleviable, but shall be deemed to be in the custody of the law enforcement agency making the seizure and whenever property or money is forfeited under this chapter it shall be utilized as follows:
- (1) Where the seized property is a vessel, vehicle, aircraft, or other personal property it may be retained and used by the law enforcement agency that seized the property where the use of the property is reasonably related to the law enforcement duties of the seizing agency. If the seized property is a motor vehicle that is inappropriate for use by the law enforcement agency due to style, size, or color, the seizing agency shall be allowed to apply the proceeds of sale or the trade-in value of the vehicle towards the purchase of an appropriate vehicle for use in activities reasonably related to law enforcement duties.
- (2) The law enforcement agency may sell any forfeited property not required by this chapter to be destroyed and not harmful to the public. The proceeds from the sale are to be distributed in accordance with subdivision (3) of this subsection.

(3) As to the proceeds from the sale of seized property as referred to in subdivision (2) of this subsection, and as to moneys, coin and currency, negotiable instruments, securities, or other things of value as referred to in subsection (a) of this section, the distribution shall be as follows:

- (i)(A) All proceeds of the forfeiture of real or personal property shall be distributed as follows: All costs of advertising administrative forfeitures shall first be deducted from the amount forfeited. Of the remainder, twenty percent (20%) of the proceeds shall be provided to the attorney general's department to be used for further drug-related law enforcement activities including, but not limited to, investigations, prosecutions, and the administration of this chapter; seventy percent (70%) of the proceeds shall be divided among the state and local law enforcement agencies proportionately based upon their contribution to the investigation of the criminal activity related to the asset being forfeited; and ten percent (10%) of the proceeds shall be provided to the department of health for distribution to substance abuse treatment programs.
- (B) The law enforcement agencies involved in the investigation, with the assistance of the attorney general, shall by agreement determine the respective proportionate share to be received by each agency. If the agencies are unable to reach agreement, application shall be made by one or more of the agencies involved to the presiding justice of the superior court who shall determine the respective proportionate share attributable to each law enforcement agency. The proceeds from all forfeitures shall be held by the general treasurer in a separate account until such time as an allocation is determined by agreement of the agencies or by the presiding justice. It shall be the duty and responsibility of the general treasurer to disburse the allocated funds from the separate account to the respective law enforcement agencies.
- (ii) Each state or local law enforcement agency shall be entitled to keep the forfeited money or the proceeds from sales of forfeited property. The funds shall be used for law enforcement purposes and investigations of violations of this chapter. The funds received by a state law enforcement agency shall be maintained in a separate account by the general treasurer. The funds received by a local law enforcement agency shall be maintained in a separate account by the local agency's city or town treasurer.
- (c)(1) There is established in the state's treasury a special fund to be known as the asset forfeiture fund in which shall be deposited the excess proceeds of forfeitures arising out of criminal acts occurring before July 1, 1987. The asset forfeiture fund shall be used to fund drug-related law enforcement activity and the treatment and rehabilitation of victims of drug abuse. The fund shall be administered through the office of the general treasurer. The presiding justice of the superior court shall have the authority to determine the feasibility and amount of disbursement to those state or local law enforcement agencies that have made application.
- (2) Upon the application of any law enforcement agency of the state of Rhode Island, when a special need exists concerning the enforcement of the provisions of this chapter, the attorney general, or his or her designee, may apply to the presiding justice of the superior court for the release from the general treasury of sums of money. When the presiding justice upon consideration of the reasons set forth by that agency deems them to be reasonable and necessary to the accomplishment of a goal within the powers and duties of that law enforcement agency, he or she may issue an order ex parte providing for the release of the funds.
- (d) Each law enforcement agency making any seizure(s) that result(s) in a forfeiture pursuant to this section shall certify and file with the state treasurer between January 1 and January 30 an annual report detailing the property or money forfeited during the previous calendar year and the use or disposition of the property or money. The report shall be made in the form and manner as may be provided or specified by the treasurer and these annual law enforcement agency reports shall be provided to the local governmental body governing the agency and to the house and senate judiciary committees.
- (e) Any law enforcement agency whose duty it is to enforce the laws of this state relating to controlled substances is empowered to authorize designated officers or agents to carry out the seizure provisions of this chapter. It shall be the duty of any officer or agent authorized or designated, or authorized by law, whenever he or she shall discover any property or monies that have been, or are being, used in violation of any of the provisions of this chapter, or in, upon, or by means of which any violation of this chapter has taken or is taking

place, to seize the property or monies and to place it in the custody of the person as may be authorized or designated for that purpose by the respective law enforcement agency pursuant to those provisions.

(f) For purposes of this section and § 30-14-2 only, the Rhode Island national guard shall be deemed a law enforcement agency eligible to participate in the forfeiture of money and assets seized through counterdrug operations in which members of the guard support federal, state or municipal efforts.
