1	RESOLUTION OPPOSING NEW FOSSIL FUEL BASED ENERGY SOURCES SUCH AS THE PROPOSED INVENERGY POWER PLANT IN BURRILLVILLE

4	WHEREAS, the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Warwick are
5	matters of paramount importance to the City Council; and

7	WHEREAS, the Warwick City Council favors the use of clean and green energy sources
8	and supports the expanded use of solar power, wind turbines, and other non-fossil fuel sources
9	for energy in Warwick and the entire State of Rhode Island; and

11	WHEREAS, Rhode Island General Laws § 42-6.2 et. seq. also known as the Resilient
12	Rhode Island Act (Act) of 2014 calls for reductions of greenhouse gas emissions by 10% below
13	1990 levels by 2020, 45% below 1990 levels by 2035, and 80% below 1990 levels by 2050; and
14	
15	WHEREAS, Governor Lincoln Chafee signed this Act into law on August 1, 2014 to
16	require all state and local permitting agencies to use the Act to reduce the amount of greenhouse
17	gasses produced in the State of Rhode Island; and

19	WHEREAS, the citizens of the City of Warwick have consistently voted for and
20	approved open space, agricultural and recreational bond referendums, encouraged energy
21	efficiency programs, supported the use of alternative energy sources and other "green" energy
22	initiatives, that improve the quality of life for all Warwick residents and businesses; and
23	WHEDEAS since that time many sitizons of Dhade Island, as well as own neighboring
24	WHEREAS, since that time, many citizens of Rhode Island, as well as our neighboring
25	communities in Connecticut and Massachusetts, have expressed clear opposition to the siting of
26	the Clear River Energy Center power plant (CREC) for reasons including the impacts on
27	property, environment, emissions, need, cost, water and traffic; and
28	WHEREAS, the citizens of the City of Warwick are aware of the increasing threat to
29	our local and global environment which is primarily due to the burning of fossil fuels and
30	believes that reducing those emissions through the Act will help the citizens of the City of
31	Warwick and Rhode Island lead healthier and better lives; and

WHEREAS, the City of Warwick values the process of Democracy in all 32 communities throughout Rhode Island and feels that the Rhode Island Energy Facility Siting 33 Board (EFSB) process is inconsistent with local control of local land use; and 34 35 WHEREAS, on October 29, 2015 Invenergy Thermal Development LLC filed an 36 application to construct the Clear River Energy Center power plant (CREC) in northwestern 37 Rhode Island with the Rhode Island Energy Facility Siting Board (EFSB); and 38 39 WHEREAS, the Town of Burrillville is being sited for a proposed power plant (CREC) 40 by the RI Public Utility Commission EFSB even though the Burrillville Town Council, Zoning, 41 Planning, Tax Assessor and Town residents oppose the CREC; and 42 43 WHEREAS, as the democratically elected representatives of the people of Warwick, 44 the City Council does not support and hereby expresses serious concerns over the use of water 45 from the Scituate Reservoir, which is the primary source of water for City of Warwick, for use 46 by the Clear River Energy Center. 47 48 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Warwick 49 expresses its opposition to the expansion and creation of new fossil based energy sources such as 50 the proposed Invenergy power plant and urges the Rhode Island Energy Facility Siting Board to 51 close docket SB 2015-06 and reject the application submitted by Invenergy Thermal 52 Development LLC for a power plant in the Town of Burrillville. 53 54 55 The City Clerk is hereby directed to forward a copy of this Resolution to the Rhode Island Energy Facility Siting Board. 56 57 This Resolution shall take effect upon passage. 58 59 60 61 62 63 SPONSORED BY: COUNCILMAN CORLEY 64 **COUNCILMAN RIX** 65 66 COMMITTEE: 67 HEALTH, EDUCATION AND WELFARE
