WHEREAS, Warwick homeowners with household income so low as to qualify for the 1 City's Circuit Breaker Program but not so low that they may qualify for the City's Tax Freeze 2 Program may be particularly financially vulnerable in the event of a rising property valuation; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the City Council desires to receive data and fiscal impacts of potential 5 6 expansion of access to and increasing the values of tax exemptions for low income, elderly and/or 7 disabled homeowners. 8 9 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Warwick City Council hereby requests that 10 the Finance Director and the Tax Assessor compile the requested data and potential fiscal impacts and report back to the City Council on their findings regarding: 11 1. What is the total cost to the City of the "Circuit Breaker" exemption for the current 12 fiscal year, FY 2022, and, how many households utilize the "Circuit Breaker" 13 exemption? 14 15 2. How many households in Warwick currently utilize the "Circuit Breaker" exemption 16 17 but do not qualify for or otherwise do not utilize the "Tax Freeze" exemption? 18 3. What would be the anticipated cost in FY 2023 if the relief available through the 19 "Circuit Breaker" exemption was increased by 50% to all currently-qualifying 20 recipients? 21 22 23 4.
