Bids received prior to the time of the opening will be securely kept, unopened. No responsibility will be attached to an officer or person for the premature opening of a bid not properly addressed and identified. No bids shall be accepted via facsimile or email.

The opening of bids shall be in the order established by the posted agenda and the agenda shall continue uninterrupted until completion.

Once an item has been reached and any bids on that item has been opened, no other bids on that item will be accepted and any such bid shall be deemed late.

The contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of physical or mental handicap for any position for which the employee or applicant is qualified and that in the event of non-compliance the City may declare the contractor in breach and take any necessary legal recourse including termination or cancellation of the contract.

The successful bidder must comply with all Rhode Island Laws applicable the public works projects, including, but not limited to provisions of Chapter 13 of Title 37 of the Rhode Island General Laws, pertaining to prevailing wage rates, and all other applicable local, state and federal laws.

The City reserves the right to terminate the contract or any part of the contract in the best interests of the City, upon 30-day notice to the contractor. The City shall incur no liability for materials or services not yet ordered if it terminates in the best interests of the

City. BID SPECIFICATIONS FOR STALKER DSR SINGLE-ZONE DIRECTIONAL KA-BAND RADAR UNITS

A. PURPOSE:

The purpose of these specifications is to establish a minimum standard for patrol radar units to be used in the Warwick Police Department patrol vehicles and Speed Enforcement Programs.

B. SCOPE:

The design of the radar unit shall use state of the art technology including Ka-Band operation with all signal processing performed by a digital signal processing microprocessor. These specifications provide for a Doppler radar unit that will operate in both moving and stationary modes, and have Vehicle Speed Sensing (VSS) standard. In moving mode, the radar will measure, compute and display the speed of either an opposite lane approaching target or an opposite lane receding target. In stationary mode, the radar will, from a stationary position, measure, compute and display the speed of either an approaching or receding target vehicle. The unit will also simultaneously display both the strongest and faster target vehicles.

C. APPLICABLE REFERENCE:

The radar unit shall conform to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) Model minimum performance specifications for police traffic radar devices, shall be the latest published CPL (consumer products list) of the IACP (International Association of Chiefs of Police). Copies of the FCC and CPL approvals shall be included with the bid.

D. RADAR BID REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. <u>Production Model</u>: The basic design of all equipment offered shall be the Stalker DSR Single-Zone Directional Radar.
- 2. <u>Sample and demonstration</u>: When requested in writing by the Police Department, the bidder shall furnish a complete sample unit for examination and testing within ten calendar days.
- 3. Performance Testing and Product Evaluation: The radar may be field and laboratory tested to determine its level of performance and conformity to specifications. Emphasis will be given to the radars ability to maintain a stable target speed reading, without displaying extraneous false readings while subjected to interference from the following; laptop computers in the police cars, including when the computer is communicating via wireless transmitter, high powered television stations, UHF, VHF, an HF transmitters, vehicle alternators, ignition and electrical systems, vehicle air conditioners, fan motors, high voltage power lines, traffic signals, neon sign, etc.

- 4. <u>Certification</u>: All radar units furnished under any resulting contract shall be factory certified as to their accuracy with test procedures in conformance with the National Bureau of Standards.
- 5. <u>Familiarization and Installation Guidelines</u>: Will be provided to the Traffic Officers of the Warwick Police Department by a Stalker representative when necessary.

E. RADAR SPECIFICATIONS:

- 1. The radar unit shall consist of 2 dual Ka-band directional antennas (front and rear) with directional computer display. The mounting hardware must conform to the 2015-2017 Ford Interceptor.
- 2. The radar shall have circuitry and software that allows the radar to compare target direction relative to the radar unit.
- 3. The radar must have user controls that allow the operator to display all approaching targets, including faster targets, as well as receding targets, with the operator being able to switch from front antenna to rear antenna.
- 4. Both target speed windows (the target speed window and the locked (or faster) target speed window) must have a target direction indicator associated with them.
- 5. The antenna shall be completely enclosed by the exterior housing of the unit.
- 6. The radar shall have the ability to operate as dash/deck mounted with hard wire power/charging cable.
- 7. The radar shall include a 3-window digital readout system of the LCD type. The LCD readout shall have the capability of simultaneously displaying the target speed, a locked (or faster) target speed, and the patrol speed.
- 8. The radar unit digital readout screen shall be equipped with an on/off illumination option.
- 9. The radar shall have a four digit alphanumeric window that is used for the display of various status and mode conditions such as: LOCK, RFI, LOW, TEST, XMIT, etc.
- 10. To verify all display elements are in working order, the radar shall momentarily light all LCD segments upon power-up.
- 11. The radar shall operate in Ka-Band at a frequency.
- 12. The radar shall be accurate through its range within +1,-2 MPH. The system shall truncate (i.e. round down) all target speed numbers to the nearest whole number.

- 13. The radar shall be designed to operate satisfactorily and maintain its calibration when operated in ambient temperatures from -30° C to +70° C and in conditions of from 0 percent to 90 percent relative humidity.
- 14. Tuning forks must be provided that are permanently marked with a serial number, the radar frequency band with which it is to be used, and the associated radar speed in MPH and KPH. Tuning forks shall have factory certification as to accuracy and be accurate within $\pm 1/2$ % of the marked speed.
- 15. The radar shall include a built-in electronic calibration standard capable of maintaining specified accuracy of the equipment through the entire specified temperature range.
- 16. An operator initiated self-test will perform accuracy verification of all counting unit internal time bases used for speed computation. Any detected malfunction will result in a "FAIL" indication.
- 17. The radar is to be a single-directional radar which consist of the following features: being able to distinguish between faster or slower in same lane, lane targets in moving mode without a slower key, simultaneously track targets closing and going away.
- 18. The radar unit will also include a Vehicle Speed Sensing component which will allow automatic switching of the unit between moving and stationary modes dependent upon cruiser movement.

F. TUNING FORKS:

- 1. The radar shall come with two (2) tuning forks. These forks shall be manufacturer suggested speed inputs so as to make the radar process and display known speeds in both the stationary and moving modes. The tuning forks shall have a factory specified accuracy of plus or minus 1 MPH.
- 2. The tuning fork test shall be able to be conducted by striking and holding both forks in a stationary manner in front of the antenna. It shall not be necessary to move either fork towards or away from the antenna, especially during the same direction tuning fork test.
- 3. The tuning forks shall be stamped with the type of fork (Ka-Band), the serial number, and the speed.

G. ADDITIONAL REQUIRED ITEMS:

- 1. The vendor shall provide technical expertise and documentation including, but not limited to, the engineering principles, scientific theory and reliability, and the overall accuracy for the radar speed device for court purposes.
- 2. One (1) complete set of operating instructions including case law history in the use of traffic radar speed devices, theory and operation, and troubleshooting information shall be furnished by the vendor with <u>each radar device</u>.
- 3. Two (2) mounting brackets designed for the dashboard and rear deck of a 2015-2017 Ford Interceptor. A hard carrying case will be provided for each radar device.

H. WARRANTY AND REPAIR SERVICE:

The manufacturer agrees to provide warranty information for all parts, assemblies, and components of the radar speed device. Written proof of the warranty by the manufacturer should be furnished by the bidder and attached to the bid. The warranty shall include a full guarantee, from the manufacturer, that each radar device shall be free from defects in materials and workmanship from a period commencing with the date the radar device is received by the agency, and ending after a period of at least three (3) years. Bid shall indicate the name, address of the nearest repair facility for the radar unit being offered, and the average number of days required performing repairs. The manufacturer shall provide any and all software changes developed and implemented during the warranty period at no expense to the agency. All shipping charges (both ways) shall be at the expense of the manufacturer for the first 90 days after the placed into service date. Thereafter, this agency will be responsible for shipping costs associated with sending the radar unit to the manufacturer. The manufacturer will then be responsible for shipping costs associated with returning the radar unit to this agency.

I. BID EVALUATION:

The Warwick Police Department requires the ability to maintain speed enforcement programs using radar of the highest quality that is supported by a reputable company, which includes a guarantee that this department will get the best value for the money. Bids will be evaluated according to the grading scale below. The categories and percentages assigned to each category are as follows:
